We were determined that lockdown would not stop us celebrating Burns' Night – oh no, we held a *virtual* Burns' Night on Zoom with all the traditional ceremonies and toasts. Ken Unsworth piped in the Haggis from his sitting room in Rainhill; Liz and Sheila shared the Address to the Haggis with Liz wielding her kitchen knife to stab the beast; Pam Neill gave us her poem about Harry the Haggis; an amusing Immortal Memory was delivered by Jenny Perry (Past President of Northallerton Caledonian Society) and the Lasses were toasted by Ken Unsworth with his wife Mary giving the Reply. We even had some Burns' songs with fiddle accompaniment by Frank and Clare Park in St. Helens. A memorable evening, every bit as entertaining as the real thing and much appreciated by our many guests.

Our charitable efforts were not neglected either. Maureen organised a 'knitathon' and we produced over 20 blankets, hats and tiny cardis for the Premature Baby Unit at Royal Stoke Hospital. We were unable to hold our usual Christmas raffles and Hamper Draw, but that didn't stop us raising money for Nantwich Food Bank. We set up a Virgin Money Donation Page and our members raised a grand total of £728.45 (including Gift Aid and a few donations by cheque via our Treasurer). This amazing generosity was greatly appreciated by the Food Bank.

So What's Planned for 2021-22?

As the end of lockdown is in sight, your Committee 'met' on Zoom on Thursday 18 March to plan ahead for the new Season.

We have to comply with the requirements of the venues we use and they in turn are guided by the government and by ACRE (Action for Communities in Rural England). We have been told that dancing will not be permitted *before* 21st June. This, unfortunately, is too close to our planned Summer Dance, so we have decided to cancel that event – however we shall be holding a **Zoom Ceilidh** on **Friday 25 June** and Ian Slater has agreed to entertain us with live music. - Friday 24th June 2022 Summer Dance with music by Ian Slater at Worleston Village Hall

Some Admin Matters

You may be wondering what we are doing about the AGM. Our 2020 AGM was carried forward to 26 April 2021, but we will still be under restrictions on that date. As we are a large Society the Committee felt that a Zoom AGM would prove unwieldy and that there was a risk that many members would be excluded as a result of being unfamiliar with the technology. We decided to postpone the AGM to the Autumn when we have returned to dancing. The likely date is Mon 4th October, but this will be confirmed nearer the time.

Please consider joining the Committee – we have three vacancies, and we need 'new blood' and new ideas.

We hope that you will all renew your membership of the Society. Membership Renewal letters will be sent out in the Summer and, as usual, it would be a huge help if you could return these with payment to Sylvia before the end of August. The membership fee remains £10 per annum.
